family, they found this home in East Orleans late in the summer of 1990. They liked its layout and size, but knew that eventually adjustments would have to be made as they spent more time on the Cape.



By September of 2001, 11 years after purchasing the home, the owners could no longer live comfortably in their small, main-level bedroom and realized they needed a master suite with a walk-in closet. They approached Architectural Design Inc. in Orleans and began working with Principal Architect Peter Haig. "We had seen some of Peter's work in a home he designed for our good friends and were impressed by his creativity," explains the husband.



■ An addition in the back or side yard was not feasible due to property-line constraints. After compiling a few designs, Haig came up with a solution. "The home sits on a hill that is eight feet higher than the road, so we decided to extend the house forward, making a garage and walk-out basement possible," he explains.





■ Construction finished in May 2003. The result, detailed in the architectural drawing on this page, was a 926-square-foot addition, complete with a master bedroom (above), walk-in closet, and spacious two-car garage with doors made from fir (right), a durable, red-toned wood. An upstairs bath and main level powder room were also added to complete the 5-bedroom, 4.5-bath floor plan.
